Bridging and Foundation Skills

NZ Certificate in Foundation Skills (Level 2) Fees free

Perhaps you're new to study, or it's been a while since you last studied, and the prospect of working towards a tertiary qualification is a bit daunting.

If you don't quite meet the entry criteria, or you're not sure what course to choose our Bridging and Foundation Skills options are designed to help. We cover writing and study skills and give you a taste of several different topics.

Enjoy the benefit of smaller class sizes and passionate tutors who can give you more hands-on support. They'll work to help you succeed and to ensure you acquire relevant skills for your future.

Te Reo Māori

NZ Certificate in Te Reo (Reo Rua) (Level 3) Fees free

If you're keen to increase your skills in te reo Māori our Te Pokaitahi Reo (Te Kaupae 3) is the perfect option to take your study to a higher level.

You'll develop an intermediate level of understanding of te reo and be able to use te reo to contribute positively to the development of te reo kia tika, kia rere, kia Māori. This course is full time, four days per week and is fees-free.

The course also acknowledges regional variances in te reo.

Health Care


New Zealand Diploma in Whānau Ora (Level 5)

If your goal is to work alongside and guide people as they build up their confidence and capability, this course is for you. It's especially ideal if you're aiming to work in a care role, or as a community support worker in the mental health or disability sectors, or as a volunteer.

Whānau ora places whānau at the centre of practice in health and social services, including human development, psychology and Māori approaches to wellbeing. The Diploma in Whānau Ora is a part time course, studied over two years.

Workplace Health and Safety Practice Level 4 Online only

Ready to advance your knowledge around health and safety in the workplace? Your qualifications will be highly valued by employers. This course is ideal for supervisors and team leaders who have previous experience and a good grounding in safety practices within industry.

Forestry

New Zealand Certificate in Forest Industry Foundation Skills (Level 2) (Forest Generation Programme)* TTAF Funded

It's an exciting time for New Zealand's forestry industry, and employers are in need of more skilled workers. With farm forests maturing and more trees being planted to lift production, job opportunities keep on growing.

With the Central North Island Wood Council (CNIWC) support, industry backing and our talented tutors, we'll help grow your skills to secure entry-level roles in a commercial forestry operation or commercial harvesting operation. The course also covers fitness, health and nutrition to get you physically prepared for the work while learning the necessary skills for the job.

Automotive

We'll show you how to disassemble, measure and reassemble an engine. You'll also service engine transmission and driveline systems, and brake, steering and suspension systems.

Funding options

Targeted Training and Apprenticeships Fund (TTAF)

The Government-initiated Targeted Training and Apprenticeships Fund (TTAF) covers domestic tuition fees for selected courses until 31 December 2022.

These courses have been chosen from industries where demand from employers is strong, or is expected to grow, during NZ's recovery period from the impacts of COVID-19.

'Fees Free'

'Fees Free' covers domestic tuition fees and domestic compulsory course fees, and compulsory student services levies only. It does not cover course related costs (CRC) or exam fees.

Both the student and the programme need to be eligible. An eligible programme must be:

- Funded by the Tertiary Education Commission
- Recognised by NZQA
- At level 3 or above on the NZ Qualifications Framework; and
- 4. For industry training only at least 120 credits

Created specifically for people aged 16 to 19, the Youth Guarantee programme provides opportunity for new direction and the confidence to succeed. The Youth Guarantee funding is highly competitive, and places fill fast. There are specific eligibility criteria.
